Trouble in the sky

This is a tornado, like the one that struck the little town of Bald Knob, Arkansas, shorthy before 5:30 p.m., on March 21, 1952. With a roar like that of an express train, the twister swept through the town.

Toll: 90 homes destroyed, 156 badly damaged out of a total of 542 in the Bald Knob community; 8 people killed, more than 126 injured. In less than an hour, the Red Cross was on the job. In 10 days, it served 9800 meals, supplied 20 pints of blood, furnished shelter and clothing for those who needed it. Said
