

SPOTLIGHT

Civic Chorus

TIP O' THE MORNING: The networks have promised thorough, on-the-spot coverage of the atomic weapons tests in Nevada on Tuesday.

BENJAMIN BRITTEN'S remarkable cantata, "Rejoice in the Lamb," closed Wednesday night's concert by the Madison Civic chorus, the Zor Shrine Chanters, a chamber orchestra and soloists, and managed to overshadow the rest of the program.

There were many other good things about the concert, but what lingers longest is the Britten setting for Christopher Smart's poetry.

The 18th-century writer was mad, but there was powerful imagery in some of the lines used for the text of this cantata. Britten reflected that power, as well as the religious imagery, and even treated Smart's madness seriously. The result was wonderfully descriptive music.

Conductor **Walter Heermann** and his singers took it just as seriously, and thus gave an excellent performance. Soloists were by Warren L. Crandall, a fine lyric tenor; Mrs. Neil F. King, with a rich and strong contralto; Don Faust, a baritone who had a chance only to hint at dramatic ability; and Helen Rodina, a clear soprano.

Britten's "A Ceremony of Carols" was sung by the women of the chorus, with Margaret Rupp Cooper playing the harp accompaniment. Patricia Hilger's soprano solo, her duet with Marcel Fisher, Mrs. Cooper's harp interlude—by turns ethereal and regal—and the chorus' lively singing of "Deo Gracias" were its high points.

Violinist **Marcel Gasser** scored an individual hit, and earned the ovation she received, with her work in a portion of Mozart's "Haffner" serenade. She displayed a liquid tone, enhanced by effective bowing.

The Zor Shrine Chanters were as good as ever, with their full-bodied harmony and precise intonation and timing. Marshall Straus' brief solo in their encore, "Drink to Me Only with Thine Eyes," made one want to hear more from him.

The program also included the first public performance of **Sybil Anne Hanks' "Quiet My Heart,"** an anthem of beauty, and other choral works. Miss Hanks left her place in the audience to acknowledge long applause.

Red Cross Veterans on Air

How the best-laid plans of Red Cross sometimes had to detour incendiary bombs and 40 at 8 trains will be described from first-hand experience by four Madison veterans of Red Cross overseas service on a broadcast at 7:30 p.m. Sunday.

The program, transcribed spontaneously and without rehearsal, will be on WISC.

Only two questions were asked of the group, who are four of the more than Madison Red Cross overseas veterans: What do you recall as the highlight of your experience?

Taking part in the recorded broadcast will be Mrs. Jane Howell, a veteran of the Red Cross hospital recreation service in the European theater.

Mrs. J. Kenneth Harley, a veteran of the Red Cross China-Burma-India service;

John Warren, Red Cross field director who landed with his outfit on the Normandy beach on D-day;

Robert Carnes, who was with the Red Cross service in North Africa and Italy.

Mrs. Vern S. Bell, volunteer field representative of the mid-western area, American Red Cross, moderates the program.
