TIP OF THE MORNING: When "Fibber McGee and Molly" goes on television, Jim and Marian Jordan will not play the roles they created. This is what happened with "Amos 'n' Andy"—Freeman Gosden and Charles Correll are doing the radio show, but not the TV version.

GARY COOPER and Shirley Booth turned in the best starring performances of the 1952 movie year, critics of the nation's newspaper, magazines, wire services, news syndicates, and radio and television stations decided in the Film Daily's annual poll.

Cooper won first place for his work in "High Noon" and Miss Booth for "Come Back, Little Sheba."

Top supporting players, the critics said, were **Victor McLaglen** ("The Quiet Man") and **Terry Moore** ("Sheba"). All four are among the "Oscar" nominees for the year.

Other winners in the poll: **Juvenile players**—Bobby Driscoll ("The Happy Time") and Gigi Perreux ("Has Anybody Seen My Gal?").

Direction—Fred Zinnemann ("High Noon").

Photography—Winston C. Hoch ("The Quiet Man").

Runners-up in each classification were: **Humphrey Bogart**, male star; **Katharine Hepburn**, female star; **Anthony Quinn**, supporting actor; **Miriam Hopkins**, supporting actress; **Brandon DeWilde** and **Angela Clark**, juveniles; **John Ford's** "The Quiet Man"; direction; **George Barnes**—"The Greatest Show on Earth," photography; **Charlton Heston**, "find."

Daytime shows were "Romance of Helen Trent," Godfrey's five segments, "Our Gal Sunday," "Aunt Jenny," "Guiding Light," and "Wendy Warren."
