WISCONSIN'S latest Hollywood success is Don Weis, the film city's youngest director, whose screen credits include "I Love Melvin," which opens today at the Orpheum; "Remains to Be Seen," and "Affairs of Doble Gills."

Don was born in Milwaukee, the son of Meyer and Emma Weis. In that city's Riverside high school, he won considerable attention in both music and drama.

"But ever since I can remember," Don says, "I wanted to direct for the stage or for pictures. So, right after high school graduation, I headed for Hollywood."

His first step toward his goal was enrollment in the cinematography course at the University of Southern California. To pay his way, he worked at odd jobs. One of them—as a theater usher—led to a post as messenger at the Warner studios.

Weis enlisted in World War II and served as script supervisor and dialog director in a motion picture unit with the 14th Army Air Force Base unit. After his discharge, he became script supervisor on "Bel Ami." Dore Schary of MGM "discovered" Weis and gave him his first directing job—the "Letter from Korea" sequence of "It's a Big Country."

He hopes to make his first trip back home this summer.
