ENGLISH COMEDIES of the Restoration and the period immediately thereafter are so similar in style and content that it's a feat of production to make them appear dissimilar and, at the same time, enjoyable by a modern audience

This Prof. Ronald Mitchell and the Wisconsin Players achieved Tuesday night in Sir John Vanbrugh's "The Provoked Wife." Imaginative direction, capable acting, and a distinguished mounting did the trick.

Language which the program euphemistically called "blunt" was a characteristic of the rowdy comedy, whose plot revolved around suspected but incompleted infidelity. It was about an unknightly knight whose wife falls in love with

a foppish Mr. Constant, and whose niece bewitches a supposedly confirmed bachelor, who in turn is sought by the vain and affected Lady Fanciful. Plot and counterplot became as involved as an operatic libretto, so we'll let it go this way.

James Brandon headed the cast as the snuff-sniffing drunker husband, excelling in his buffoonery anything seen before this season in a Players production. One scene in which he disguises himself in his wife's dress to face a constable was riotously funny.

Arthur Dorlag played the cynical, impertinent, philosophizing bachelor with just the right shade of satire on this stock character (it dates back to Shakespeare, or earlier), and Donald Spencer was properly romantic as the wife's lover.

Arlyn Zeller, as the neglected wife; Diane Derus, as the niece Helen Lauritzen, as Lady Fanciful, and Hedwig Schubert, as her ultra-French maid won honors, too, with fine characterizations. George Bird was a standout in a minor role as the knight's butler.

and James Ramsey and Vernon Bruette, as uniformed stagehands, won laughs and applause just by walking on and off stage. Fredrick Buerki contributed another of his appropriately functful

sets, which stood throughout the show except for changes in properties and sliding backgrounds to set the scenes.


