Choir Concert

Anyway, by the time we were ready to leave I had read the book from cover to cover for Eddie and

I'm sure it helped him a little. So as you can see, every time I look at "My Favorite Football Stories," by Bill Stern, it will remind me of how much it helped two kids that were scared to death."

'HERITAGE OF LOVE: "This I Give—above all else a heritage of love," a collection of Barbour family memorabilia accumulated during the years by Father Barbour, is a new booklet being offered to members of the NBC "One Man's Family" radio program, which starts its 22nd year on the air April 29.

In the dedication of the booklet, author Carlton E. Morse writes that portions of it are out of Father Barbour's dusty and aging files, and part are out of the deep places of his secret heart. In one sense then, this pertains to a single family, but in a greater sense what belongs to the Barbour clan belongs to every American family.

Morse concludes, "Therefore, Father Barbour's photographic will and memory book is dedicated to the Foundation Stone of our way of life, the American Family."

The booklet includes a collection of pictures of five generations of the Barbour family — from baby pictures of Mother and Father Barbour's five children, Paul, Hazel, Claudia, Clifford and Jack, to their great-grandson, Paul. Also included are messages from Father Barbour to the members of his family and such items as a grocery bill dated Sept. 25, 1931; a list of Paul's 10 most thumbed-through bedside volumes; a complete calendar of Barbour family dates; a detailed picture of the Barbour house showing the rooms occupied by the family members; kitchen hints; items of baby lore, and a list of Father Barbour's most precious documents.

WMTV to Carry Shows of 3 Major Networks
