

NEWSREELS: More than eight of every 10 people who go to the movies enjoy the newsreel and expect it as part of the program when they attend, according to a survey of moviegoers' tastes, attitudes, and preferences.

The survey, made by Sindlinger and Co., one of the nation's leading research organizations in the entertainment field, was conducted in a densely populated section of Philadelphia where television has reached an 80 per cent saturation, and in Wilkes-Barre, a TV fringe area. More than 5,300 interviews were recorded in both groups and in all social and salary brackets.

The survey disclosed that 83.6 per cent of the moviegoers—most of them TV set owners—want the newsreel and expect it when they go out to the theater. The rest indicated they could take it or leave it.

As for the comparison between TV news presentations and theater newsreels, the survey found that 52 per cent overwhelmingly prefer the newsreel in theaters; 44 per cent enjoy the theater newsreel but also like to look at TV newscasts to catch the daily news flashes; 4 per cent thought there was little difference between the two.

Many of the people interviewed, said that viewing the TV news-casts at home stimulated their desire to see the theater reels.
