A POLICY of spreading leading roles among many persons rather than giving them always to the same small group is one of things this department likes about the Madison Theater Guild.

Take "Gramercy Ghost," which will be presented Thursday and Friday nights at West high school and Saturday night at East.

The leading part will be played by Lou Doriag, who since 1951 has had four parts in the Guild's 14 adult plays—Celia, second woman in importance in "As You Like It," the romantic interest in "Two Blind Mice," one of four or five equally important roles in "Dangerous Corner," and a small part in "Dinner at 8." Three men have top roles in "Gramercy Ghost," and all are new to "big" parts. They are Norman Michie, Bernard Schlanger, and Henry Buslee.

In smaller roles are two women who had important parts in the seasons from 1949 through 1953—Marjorie Schaffer ("Papa Is All," "Dangerous Corner," "Johnny Belinda," and "The Corn Is Green"), and Jeanne Remus Neher ("Laura," "Dangerous Corner," "Twilight and "Remember Mama").

Proceeds will be used to complete and furnish a private room for children at the hospital.
