



TIP O' THE MORNING: The concert which the Philharmonic chorus of Madison gave last week was recorded and will be broadcast at 9 p.m. Sunday over WHA-FM.

VIRTUOSO SOLO performances and generally excellent playing of a varied program brought Madison's civic music season to an end Wednesday night.

The concert by the Madison Civic Symphony orchestra also was the last such program in the Masonic auditorium, will not be available next season.

William Druckenmiller, flutist, and Marie Endres, violinist, were standouts among the soloists, Walter Heermann conducted.

Druckenmiller was practically superb in Griffes' "Poem for Flute and Orchestra," an amazing piece in itself and a demanding one for the soloist, who performed the sombre opening and the gay dance with equal fluency. His sustained notes were round and full, his flights of tone marvels of dexterity.

Using only the usual strings with harp, French horns, and a bit of percussion to back the soloist, Griffes produced more color than one could imagine coming from so small a group. Mrs. D. M. Pickart played a lovely viola solo passage.

French horns of another kind—Parisian taxicab horns—were heard for another kind of color in Gershwin's "An American in Paris," as exact a tone picture as a modern composer has produced. If there is anything wrong with the piece, it's this very characteristic
