

TIP OF THE MORNING: "A Visit with Frank Lloyd Wright" will be televised Sunday, May 17, by NBC-TV.

A FANCIFUL story about a girl who inherits a ghost opened Thursday night at West high school auditorium.

The cast, directed by Al Barraclough, overcame the inherent difficulties of the fantastic goings-on with skill and grace.

It sounds much more confusing than the smooth production really was, for the players made each characterization clear and each situation easily understood.

The ghost was a scilder of the Revolution, doomed to be earth-bound until papers he had failed to deliver were recovered by the descendant of the man for whom they were intended.

The comedy, then, was about his willingness to stay on earth when he fell in love with Nancy and about her romantic difficulties with two human suitors, one of whom succeeded in slaying the ghost with the unintentional help of his rival.

A surprise climax added to the fun. Low Dorlag, as the girl, was convincing in her acceptance of the ghost's reality.

Henry Buslee made one of the suitors a believable reporter, sincere under a surface sophistication. Bernard Schlanger, as his

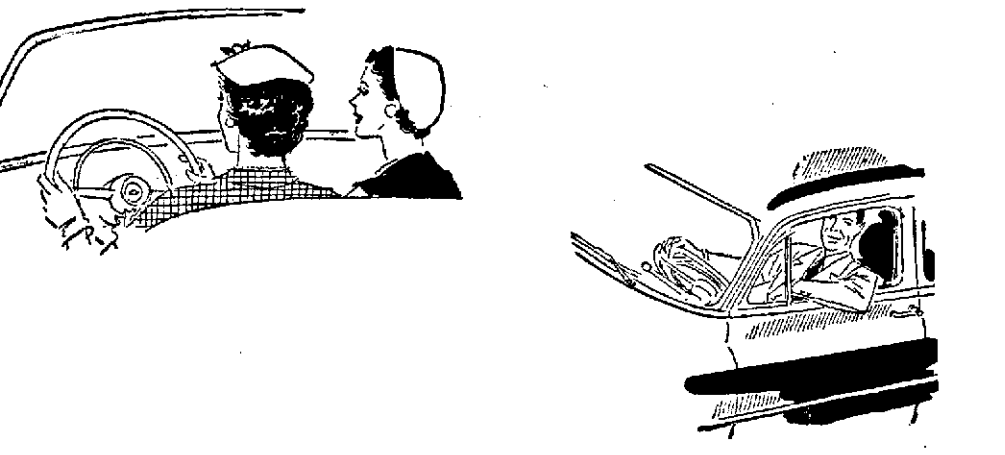

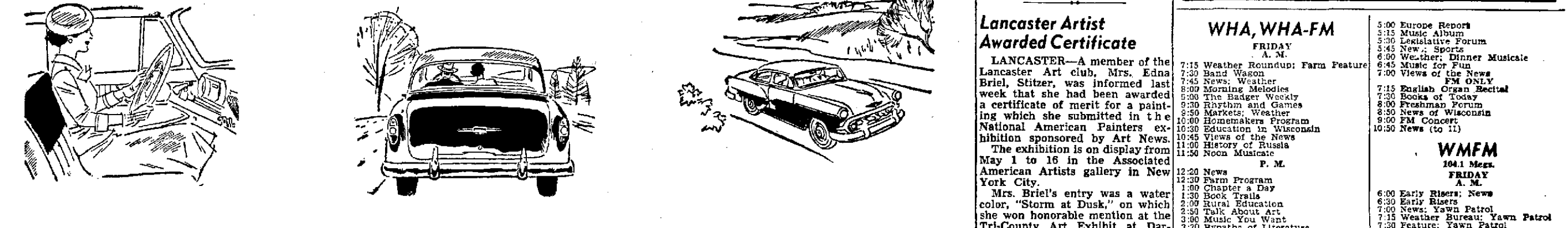
