TIP OF THE MORNING: Highlights of the National Spelling Bee in Washington, D. C., will be broadcast Wednesday afternoon by CBS.

LIVING TRIBUTE To the memory of Lucy Irene Buck—the Salon of School Art, which she was instrumental in founding—opened Sunday at Scanlan hall with scores of samples of work produced in Madison's public schools on the walls and in show cases.

Prof. Michael Andrews of the University of Wisconsin art education department, who presented \$110 in prizes, two medals, and certificates of honorable mention, said the judges agreed on the "creative virtue" of the show, with its examples of the work of the children, not of teachers or professors.

Frederick Carpenter, past president of the sponsoring Madison Art Assn., paid tribute to Miss Buck, saying that "we can never repay the debt of gratitude for making Madison conscious of the art in the public schools."

Silver medals for outstanding work went to Joanne Jahr, Lincoln school pupil and daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Bert N. Jahr, and Dagny Quisling, West high pupil and daughter of Dr. and Mrs. A. A. Quisling.

One medal was given in the elementary school group, the other in the high school division. Dagny's tempera, "Night Scene," and Joanne's water color of a waterfall, will become part of the schools' permanent collection.

 Working behind the scenes to set up this unique show is a committee of Wisconsin students interested in the rural art movement.
 General chairman of the state show is Rosemary Jeffrey, junior in home economics from Madison. Mary Kennedy, home economics junior from Norwayville, is in charge of the kick-off luncheon in the union Saturday. Lydia Lea Cline, junior in secondary education from Tomah, is in charge of the luncheon program; Duane Moore, senior in agriculture from Almena, is chairman of entries and exhibitors; Norbert Deyl, senior in agriculture from Green Bay, is chairman of catalogs; Edward Hasselkus, junior in agriculture from Dousman, is chairman of the state show.
