TIP O' THE MORNING: Edgar Allan Poe's "The Murders in the Rue Morgue" will be filmed in third dimension under the title "The Phantom Ape."

IF YOU EVER fly at 18,000 feet in a plane whose cabin isn't pressurized, you'll find out when you land just how one's eardrums felt at the end of Wednesday night's jazz concert in the Wisconsin Union theater.

For a finale, the Benny Goodman orchestra and Louis Armstrong's All-Stars joined in the loudest, brassiest hunk of playing on record, the sound increased by the clapping, stamping, and screaming of the capacity audience.

Armstrong's group opened the show, and Goodman—with Gene Krupa in charge—played the second half, with the 19 men uniting for the finale, "When the Saints Go Marching In."

This was the first time your reviewer ever felt the theater's balcony vibrate, which gives you some idea of the crowd's enthusiasm. Interest in the night concert was so great that would-be listeners of a number of tricks to get in.

Two boys carrying tickets for Tuesday night's show at Boloit, sneaked into the theater between shows and hid out in a washroom near attempting to get seats at night. The matinee here, however, was rather sparsely attended—about 600.

As for the concert, these high points tell the story:

In the Armstrong half, the free and easy playing... Louis' own great comedy sense, bringing more fun than one usually gets in a show of this kind, and his trumpet playing... Bubbling Joe Bushkin's piano solo... Cozy Cole's and Barney Bigard's deceptive calm, with smash performances...

Others in the cast will be Rose Corcoran, Jerry Fredericks, Nancy Ryan, George Blodgett, Mrs. Marie Ledford, A. Tuten, Jim Brickson, Mary Gallagher, Pat McLeish, and Jim Bergenske.

Otto Bergenske is director and Jerry Bergenske is technical adviser. Proceeds will go to the parish school fund.
