The proposal, passed 32-0, was drafted by a special committee on chief of Beefeaters.

Final legislative approval was given in the Senate to a bill that appropriates \$3,127,000 for operation of the highway department for the next two years. The appropriation is about \$250,000 more than was spent this biennium.

Most of the increase is for establishment of a micro-wave radio system for the State Motor

Vehicle Department.

The bill also increases the appropriation for roads at state col-leges and institutions. At present \$50,000 is set aside for this purpose. Under the hill \$100,000 will be spent.

Goes to Governor

An Assembly measure that reg-ulates the amount of butterfat that must be contained in food advertised as flavored with butter was amended and sent back to that house. The Assembly wanted such food to contain 20 per cent butterfat. The Senate cut it to 12 per cent.

Concurred in was an Assembly bill that would enable the Public Service Commission to require clearing of timber from flowage arcas. The measure was sent back to the Assembly for action on a minor amendment.


