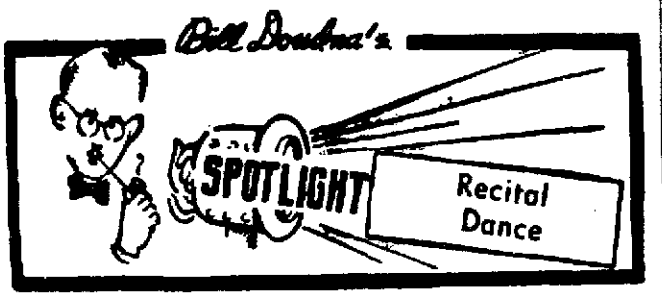

SILVER ANNIVERSARY: From prohibition through price control, "American Forum of the Air" has been a sounding board for opinions on social, political, and economic questions for 25 years.
