Churchmen Back Regulated Probes

WAUKESHA (U)—The right of Congress to make investigations was affirmed but unregulated congressional probes were criticized Wednesday as "contrary to our American heritage" by delegates to the annual meeting of the Wisconsin Synod of the Presbyterian church.

A bitter debate preceded adoption of the resolution which said "we explore the possibility that guilt by suspicion and investigation rather than by trial may become the future standard of justice within our land."

The church group's resolution also said "we clearly affirm the right of Congress to make investigations as may be necessary to secure information on which sound legislation may be based, but we call on Congress to establish uniform rules of procedure for all investigations in which the rights of the witnesses shall be specified and protected."

Clarence G. Smeaton of Milwaukee, retiring moderator of the synod, and James Daum of Oshkosh, the new moderator, both said "church members should stay in their own province" and Daum said the resolution "does not prove the Constitution was violated but only makes a general statement."

Three hundred Presbyterian clergymen and laymen attended the meeting.
