## McCarthy's Free Mailing Activity Will Be Checked

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Postmaster General Arthur E. Summerfield asked his staff Friday for a report on the free mailing activities of Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy (R-Wis.).

McCarthy Thursday accused Sen. Herbert H. Lehman (D-N.Y.) of committing a "rather gross abuse" of the congressional franking privilege. He said Lehman tried to mail out 100,000 letters on "creeping McCarthyism" without postage.

Lehman replied that it was only 1,000 letters and the franking privilege was not involved. He said the postoffice tried to collect from McCarthy last year for the free mailing of advertisements for his book, "McCarthyism, the Fight for America."

There is no penalty attached to abuse of the free mailing privilege. The only recourse is to ask the person involved to pay for the postage.

It is customary for senators to insert into the Congressional Record speeches they make outside of the Chamber, thus qualifying them for the Senate floor.

The guaranty, covering an eight-year period, means that the U. S. government will make up any unfavorable exchange conditions between dollars and Danish kroner.

A company in Denmark is paying patent royalties to Ray-O-Vac, and if Ray-O-Vac should be unable to convert the Danish currency from the investment into American dollars through regular channels, the government would convert the money.

The guaranty, however, ends at \$182,500.

**Pole Gets 5 Years**

For Spying Against U.S.

LINZ, Austria (UPI) — A 29-year-old Pole was sentenced Friday to five years imprisonment for spying against the U. S. Army in Austria on behalf of the Czechoslovak intelligence service.

Henryk Jan Czuczurzyk admitted in a U. S. civil affairs court that he gathered reports on refugees at the U. S. refugee center at Wels.

Later in the day, the President said he honestly hopes the prisoner of war agreement reached at Panmunjom "will speedily lead to an armistice and just peace in Korea and to a relaxing of world tensions."

He made the statement in a letter to Prime Minister Nehru of India.

The President is scheduled to fly today to New Hampshire.
