

In addition to the "birthday" gifts which he will receive as an "Original Breakfast Club Baby," Round will have an added surprise: His mother will be flown to Chicago to greet her son.

The program will include an hour-long parade, and \$2,500 in prizes will be awarded. The event is sponsored by the Cedarburg fire department.

Christoffel Gets Jail Term, Fine for Lie at Hearing

WASHINGTON — Harold R. Christoffel, former Milwaukee union official, was sentenced to 18 months and four years in jail and fined \$100 Monday for lying to the House Labor Committee about his Communist connections.

Federal Judge F. Dickinson Letts denied Christoffel's request for a new trial and a defense motion that he set aside the conviction. He also denied Christoffel bail pending an appeal. The union leader immediately was put in the District of Columbia jail.

Christoffel first was convicted in 1946 on charges he lied to the committee when he denied he ever was a Communist. The conviction was reversed on grounds the government did not prove a majority of the committee was present when he testified.

He was tried and convicted a second time in March, 1950.

Conflicts a Handicap Protestant Group Told

WILLIAMS BAY (UP) — Confusion within Protestantism has handicapped a religious crusading spirit seeking to solve conflicts over social issues, the National Conference of the Association of Council Secretaries heard Sunday.

Lawrence T. Hosie, executive secretary of the Syracuse, N. Y., Council of Churches, said: "To date we have been so divided, not in what we believe so much as in our approach to problems, that our people are not conscious that religion has any great effect on social attitudes and morality."

The week-long session was called to exchange information among staff executives of local, state, national, and world councils of churches executives.

Bolivians Nab Group Listed as Subversive

LA PAZ, Bolivia (UP) — La Paz Police Chief Lt. Col. Fidel Rojas, former Police Chief Col. Victor Valdez and more than a dozen other prominent persons have been arrested on charges of subversive activity, assistant Police Chief Col. Victor Ramirez said Monday.

"Elements in the pay of the oligarchy sought to unleash a subversive movement but did not make headway because of the determination of the people and the corps of carabinieri," Ramirez said.
