TIP O' THE MORNING: A portion of the Wisconsin-Northwestern football game on Nov. 7 will be televised on NBC.

**BRYAN DUNCAN**, back from an eight-month tour of Europe, will play a nine-day engagement at the Hoffman House starting Saturday.

The blind pianist left Madison on Sept. 5 for a vacation overseas, on which he hoped to play a few concerts for men and women in the armed forces.

By the time he started his tour, he had played 150 programs on two continents.

About half of these were for service men and women.

Duncan played in hotels, concert halls, town halls, service clubs, and hospitals.

He went as far east as Istanbul, Turkey, and as far south as Algiers.

To get around, he used just about every kind of modern conveyance—ocean liner, commercial and air force planes, command cars, trains, and even Venetian gondolas.

Bruce Protzman, 16-year-old Milwaukee pianist, is one of three young musicians who will attend the National Music camp at Interlochen, Mich., under NFMC scholarships. The others are Ann Widere, 15, pianist, Des Plaines, Ill., and Charles Scott III, 16, clarinetist, Nashville, Tenn.

June Allison has been added to the cast of "Executive Suite", which MGM will film in August. Elizabeth Taylor has recovered from a serious eye injury and started work last week on "Rhapsody".

**SUMMER PLAYS:** Exactly 95,664 season books have been sold for the Wisconsin Players winter and summer playbills since the opening of the Wisconsin Union theater in 1939, according to Prof. John Dietrich, who has been business manager of the campus drama group since 1942. Though Wisconsin Players has existed as a drama group since 1922, records for the early years are not in existence, so a complete figure is not possible. This means that about 500,000 persons have seen the plays on a subscription basis in the new theater. Thousands of others have attended on an individual ticket basis when any remained after season sale, and when extra performances have been scheduled to meet demand.

Season ticket sale is now open for the 1953 summer playbill which includes productions of "Affairs of State" by Louis Verneuil; "Mrs. Warren's Profession" by George Bernard Shaw; "Playboy of the Western World" by J. M. Synge; and "Born Yesterday" by Garson Kanin.

Each play will have three performances in the air-conditioned Wisconsin Union theater.

**"Ice Capades" to Open City Ticket Office**

A Madison ticket office for "Ice Capades of 1953," which will start Wednesday, July 15, at the Milwaukee County Stadium, was opened Wednesday at the Wisconsin-Felton Sporting Goods Co.

The show will play through Tuesday, July 21, with performances nightly at 8:15.

The ice show will be the first event other than baseball to be held in the stadium.

Featured in "Ice Capades" will be Dick Button, only man ever to win all awards and medals offered in figure skating; Bobby Speght, figure skating star from Superior, Wis.; Donna Atwood, another figure skating champion, and others.
