PLOT: A socialite (Rosalind Russell), the divorced daughter of a U. She is detoured from the goal, but meets a former burlesque queen (Marie Wilson) in the WAC whose desire is to be part of the WAC Intelligence Service, although she has none to spare. Our two heroines brave the hazards of Army life, including a stint in testing service gear, but survive in the best situation comedy comedy.

HIGH POINTS: Fast-moving satire slows up considerably near the end of the picture, with the finish almost anti-climatic.

VERDICT: Delightful comedy, shaky in spots, but enhanced by Miss Russell's performance.
