Senate OKs Residence for Polish Flier

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Senate Monday passed and sent to the House a bill giving per-manent U. S. residence to Lt. Franciszek Jarecki, Polish pilot who recently flew a Russian-made MIG-15 jet out from be-hind the Iron Curtain.

The House had passed a similar measure barlier.

Jarecki flew the MIG to the Danish Island of Bornholm last Mar. 5, giving engineers from free world countries their first chance to inspect an undamaged plane of this type.
