UN May Act Against Rhee in Truce Action

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (UP)—United Nations (UN) Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjold warned Friday that the UN might have to take measures against Korean President Syngman Rhee if he defies a truce and tries to unify Korea by force.

The Swedish diplomat said: "It is a curious sight, indeed, when a victim of aggression voices intentions which might themselves call for repression in the name of those very principles which have given him protection when he was attacked."

High UN sources said no such UN move was planned "at present."

Shorewood, Bluff School Measure Signed by Kohler

NEW YORK (AP)—Bronx zoo officials believed Friday that Penelope the platypus was about to make zoo history by hatching the first duckling platypus ever bred in this nation.

"We'll just have to wait and see," one excited attendant said.

The anxious officials based their prediction on Penelope's coy behavior of late. Last night she skipped her dinner, crawled into her eucalyptus-lined burrow and hasn't been seen since.

If Penelope is really laying eggs, they should hatch in six to 10 days. But nobody but Penelope will see the baby platypus for possibly four months, when they can be expected to make their first trip into the world.

If a little platypus does emerge from the nest it will be the climax of a long and frustrating romance. For six long years Penelope courted the attentions of Cecil, the only male in her world.

The only other platypus bred in captivity was born in its native Australia in 1943.

4 Firms, Union Office Robbed of \$199 in Cash

Four Madison business places and a labor union office were robbed early Friday by burglars who escaped with at least \$199 in cash and money orders, police reported Friday afternoon.

At Phil's Shoe Hospital, 223 King st., police said the thieves entered through an unlocked rear window and stole \$60.

At the Building Trades union office, 115 W. Main st., headquarters for the steamfitters' and electricians' unions, the burglars took \$60 and about 100 unopened letters which contained an undetermined amount of checks and money orders which were sent in for union dues.

There were \$60 in bills and about 15 silver dollars stolen from Sullin's service station, 3030 Milwaukee st.

At Mickey's Lunch, 2045 Pennsylvania ave., the thieves ripped the screen on a rear window and escaped with about \$5.

The burglars entered Rod's Appliance shop, 2609 Sherman ave., by smashing a rear window, but apparently left empty handed, police said.

Employe Residence Bill Drawn by City Attorney

An ordinance which would present city employes living inside the city limits from moving outside was filed with the city clerk's office Friday afternoon for introduction to the City Council.

The ordinance was drawn by the city attorney's office at the request of Ald. Carl Wilhelm, fifth ward, after Mayor George Forster told the council Thursday night he would permit any city employe to live outside the city limits if the council set policy.

Forster's order to city employes living outside the city without permission to move in by April 1, 1954 was overruled by the council, and the time extended to April 1956.

Irked by the council action, Forster told the council of his intentions to give more liberal permission, and Wilhelm's ordinance resulted.

Director Emmett Sarig said that the program has been planned so that "a director from a small school can attend all sessions in band, orchestra, and chorus, and a director from a large school can spend all his time in just one field."

The directors will be welcome to attend classes and rehearsals of the music clinic when they are not at their own sessions.

Clinics on specific instruments and voices and in marching, lectures by Victor Kolar, Stanford Hulshizer, and Maurice McAdow, conductors of the All-State organizations at the high school clinic, will be on the program.

Maurice McAdow, director of the All-State High School bands, will be guest conductor. Raymond Zwicky, trombonist, and Ruth Zerler and Raymond Culp, vocalists, will be soloists.
