House Unit Votes to Hold Hearings on Postal Boost

WASHINGTON (UP) — The House Postoffice Committee overrode rebellious Republican mem-bers by a narrow one-vote mar-gin Monday and agreed to con-tinue hearings on the administra-tion's request for higher mail rates.

The vote, in which the chair-nan cast the deciding ballot, followed an angry 20-minute wrangle with Postmaster General Arthur E. Summerfield trying unsuccess-fully to make himself heard above

one din.

So loud were the objections that a Democrat, Rep. Tom Murray (Tenn.), complained he was "mortified" by the way the Republicans behaved. He said they publicans behaved, he said they had shown the "rankest kind of discourtesy" to a cabinet officer.

But Chairman Edward H. Rees (R.Kas.), whose vote broke a 10-10 tie, said the hairline decision does not necessarily mean there will be any action on Summerfield's proposal this year. It merely means the committee will continue hearings "in the regular order."

House Unit Approves **Immigration Proposal**

WASHINGTON (UP) --- . House Judiciary subcommittee voted Monday to admit an additional 247,000 immigrants — many of them Iron Curtain refugees---to the United States in the

next two years.

The total was 7,000 larger than requested by President Eisenhower, but the committee alter-ed the President's program to admit persons of eight other thnic groups.

As proposed by Mr. Eisenhower, the bill would have admitted 125,000 persons who escaped or were expelled from behind the Iron Curtain, 75,000 Italians living in Italy or Trieste, 20,000 of Dutch origin and 20,000 of Dutch origin, and 20,000 of Greek origin.
The subcommittee cut Iron

Curtain escapees to 110,000 and the Italian immigrants to 60,000. But it increased the Greek and Dutch quotas to 25,000 each,



WASHINGTON IN — Congress approved a compromise bill Monday authorizing the administration to spend \$5,157,232,000 for foreign aid during the current fiscal year which started July 1.
