

### Senate Passes Small Loans Bill

Approves Agency to Succeed RFC

WASHINGTON (UP) senate Monday passed by voice tration, Tennessee Valley Authorvote a bill to create a small busi-ity, and Selective Service system ness administration with author-in the current fiscal year. ity to make 10-year loans up to \$200,000.

The agency would replace the 21 year-old Reconstruction Finance Corp. (RFC) which makes loans high in the millions. loans high in the millions.

Opposition to the measure was overridden when Chairman Homer E. Capehart (R-Ind.) of the Senate Banking Committée read a letter from President Elsenhower supporting the legislation. The House has passed a similar bill, so a compromise must be worked out. News Matines Matines News: F'rm Pen Farm Front

Mr. Elsenhower praised the committee for approving the bill and said it would help his administration achieve its objective of "encouraging and developing small business." mall business small business.

Some senators objected to the RFC section. Sen. William Langer (R-N. D.) said the RFC was es-

(R-N. D.) said the Arc was 23-tablished under Republican lead-ership and "I just can't see why anyone would want to abolish it." The new agency could make loans up to \$200,000 if the borrowloans up to \$200,000 if the borrowers could not get private credit.
The loans would be financed by a \$300,000,000 revolving fund.

Of this amount, \$150,000,000 would be earmarked for small business loans, \$25,000,000 for disagter loans, and another \$25,000. aster loans, and another \$25,000. 000 for loans to municipalities and other public bodies.

Langer said that "if this bill passes, you are stifling and wrecking every small state in the union." He said the death of the RFC would cut off a source of credit to small town groups.

Sen. J. William Fulbright (D-Ark.) warned the Senate that it was making a "great mistake" to abolish the RFC. He said "it offends my sense of propriety to participate in a purely phony political move."




