

similar to true ants in several ways. Male termites, also the queens, have wings during parts of their lives, and this is true among true ants as well. A mong the true ants, the queens fly about until they find what seems like a good location for a nest. Then their wings are bitten off, or otherwise broken off. Male ants may keep their wings somewhat longer than do the queens, but male ants have short lives. Let it be noted, however, that

Ants Capture, Train Slaves

Let it be noted, however, that the vast majority of ants go through their lives without wings. These are the workers, and they toil at gathering food. Much of the food is brought back to the nest. The workers feed the queen, and also give food to the young. Some kinds of ants keep slaves. Among these are the red Amazon ants, also the red-and-black field ants which are common in parts of the United States.

Slave-making ants carry out raids on the nests of other kinds of ants. They may invade a nest (commonly one containing black)
