TIP O' THE MORNING: Robert Fryer is planning a Chicago company of "Wonderful Town," but you can discount rumors that Margaret Truman will play the Rosalind Russell role. She has a full concert season ahead of her.

MADISON FIGURES IN THE story of Otto Griebling, one of the stars of the clown contingent with the Ringling Brothers-Barnum and Bailey circus. The "greatest show on earth" will appear at 2:15 and 8:15 p.m. Wednesday at Truax Field.

In his fascinating book, "The Big Top," Fred Bradna describes Griebling as one of those "best clowns" who "defy imitation." His expert pantomime, Bradna writes, came from necessity. When Otto came to the U. S. from his native Germany, he knew no English—but he soon learned that he could obtain almost anything by pretending he was a deaf mute.

His first circus job was with Albert Hodgini, a noted rider. Hodgini found that Otto was unhappy and unreliable, so he withheld the apprentice's wages.

When the Ringling circus reached Madison, Bradna says, unloading was delayed and Hodgini missed lunch. He gave Otto a \$5 bill and sent him to buy two loaves of bread and a quart of milk.

"Otto pocketed the money, fed the lot, and kept on walking," the book reports. "At Sheldon, Wis., he took a job on a dairy farm."

"But two years later, with the circus again at Madison, Otto returned to it. Cautiously he poked about until he discovered Hodgini was still with the show."

"He went to a grocery store, bought two loaves of bread and a quart of milk, and took them to Hodgini with change from the \$5 bill."

"Hodgini was too stunned to speak. Then he laughed. 'It took you a long time,' he said. 'Get dressed for the act.'"
