Truax Field News, Views

 Saturday, Sept. 26, is National Kid's Day.

The Kiwanis Club and the International Kid's Day Foundation are sponsors with the Air Force and other services acting as co-sponsors wherever possible to assist in the planning and program of the Day.

This year, as last year, the youngsters of the Madison area will be welcomed to Truax Field in what should shape up as a tremendous display of aircraft and equipment both on and off the ground.

Last year, over 500 youngsters with some parents and leaders attended, and an even greater number should come this year to see the most modern fighter planes and equipment in the Air Defense Command, a command charged with the defense of the nation against air attack.

This year, last year's events are being improved, as well as some new ones added. Truax will have added a new fighter to its combat potential even since the last open house and static display on Armed Forces Day in May of this year. It's the F-86D, which is the Air Force's only "line" operational single-seater radar-equipped jet interceptor.

Air Force hosts will be on hand to explain all of the equipment operations of an Air Force base, which includes procedures during an alert. Wheels are turning to get a "mock" alert staged, but that is dependent on the status of defense at that time.

More plane facts. Jet engine built by a single U. S. manufacturer have flown more than 600 million miles. The 6 to 12 fuel tanks in a modern Air Transport plane hold 10,000 gallons; slightly more than two railroad cars.

Each new production model of a jet warplane requires some 10,000 engineering drawings plus 25,000 tools. A single jet engine manufacturer purchased 56 million engine pieces—as well as inspecting each them. The wings of some late-model aircraft have 35 hatches through which mechanics and inspectors check the intricate machinery inside.

The Ground Observer system was initiated in its present use by Chinese "spotters" for Gen. Claire Chennault's Flying Tigers. But the British began using it about 1930, and it proved very effective during the days of the Battle of Britain.

U. S. Ships Begin Withdrawing from Greek Quake Area

ATHENS, Greece (UP) — U. S. warships began withdrawing from the earthquake-wrecked Ionian islands Monday, amid reports that hungry islanders are looting shattered homes and fighting over relief supplies.

The 10 American ships that rushed here to aid survivors have landed \$1,000,000 worth of food, other supplies and equipment, and U. S. Vice-Adm. John H. Cassidy notified Premier Alexander Panagos that they cannot remain in the area much longer.

Seven ships of the American relief fleet sailed Monday, including the heavy cruiser Salem—Cassidy's flagship—and the aircraft carrier Franklin D. Roosevelt. The other three are scheduled to leave at 8 p. m. Wednesday.

Meanwhile, late reports from the stricken archipelago told of trouble at various points on Cephalonia, Ithaca, and Zante, the three hardest-hit islands.

The last of the fires that swept Zante in the wake of the quakes had hardly been extinguished when an army patrol detected a band of looters foraging in the ruins of homes and business houses. The troops opened fire, killing two plunderers, but an undetermined number of others got away.

At the same time, Gen. I. Iatrides, Greek commander in the islands, urgently asked the U. S. rescue fleet to halt its helicopter drops of food in isolated areas because the islanders are fighting each other for the emergency provisions.

Indiana Troopers Open Phone Offices

CLINTON, Ind. (AP) — Gov. George N. Craig called out state police troopers in the strife-torn Indiana telephone strike Monday and they reopened the exchange here on his orders.

Three carloads of troopers, some sent from headquarters at Indianapolis, met six Bell Telephone Co. workers at the outskirts of the city and escorted them into the exchange building.

E. R. Moore, an acting Bell supervisor, said the reopening was accomplished without incident.

But Moore said about a dozen pickets, mostly women who were parading with signs, "razed" the returning workers.

The Clinton exchange was closed late Sunday when Bell withdrew its workers after about 24 hours of recurring violence.
