

### Sheboygan Woman Couldn't Believe Husband Released

of war camp. Brom, an Air Force radar op-erator, was in a B-29 which was shot down in a night raid June 10, 1952. Military officials in Washington were pessimistic about his fate. Mrs. Brom said. and all her letters came back from POW camps with notices that her husband was not a pris-

"A friend called me and asked if I heard the news about Tony, she said. "I asked what news and she said he was freed.
"I thought she was kidding me. but then lots of my friends started calling and finally, guess. I believe it now and it's

wonderful."

Brom, 32, was recalled to active duly with the Air Force in July, 1951, and sent to a bomber base on Okiniwa in March, for "six months temporary duty." his wife said. About three months later he was shot down. The Broms have a 4-year-old


