THE 100,000th season book for a Wisconsin Players series in the Wisconsin Union theater was sold Thursday on the University of Wisconsin campus.

From the opening of sales in 1929—first year the Players used the new theater—until closing time Thursday, exactly 100,964 season books had been disposed of. Since each book contained a ticket good for each of five plays, this means that more than a half-million persons will have attended the plays on a subscription basis when the 1953-54 season ends.

More than half the available season tickets for this season had been sold Thursday night. Prof. John Dietrich, associate director of the campus group, reported. More than 2,500 were distributed in the first two days of the sale.

## JACOBY ON BRIDGE

By Oswald Jacoby

North's bidding in today's hand is a little strange, but not really bad. North had no convenient bid when West overcalled with two hearts.

When South reopened the bidding, however, North decided that there was probably a sound play for game since South's rebid showed a good hand and a good spade suit.

North should have been content with a simple raise to three spades, and the chances are that South might have gone on to four spades even though he had already bid his full strength.

West opened the king of hearts, naturally enough, and East signalled discouragingly with the deuce. This made it clear that South had only two hearts, since if East had held the doubleton he would have begun by playing his higher heart.

West reasoned that South was bound to have the ace of clubs, and that the contract could not be defeated if South also had the queen of diamonds. In short, West was able to pick the right defensive play as accurately as if he could see all the missing cards.

Just for the fun of it, pick West's correct defensive play before you read on. If you pick the correct lead at trick two, even though you are looking at all of the cards, you can congratulate yourself on a fine job of defensive analysis.

At the second trick West must lead the king of diamonds. Now South must lose two hearts, a diamond, and a club. When the hand was actually played, South thought that West had the queen of diamonds as well, and therefore let West hold the king of diamonds.

West continued with a low diamond, and the finesse of the jack from the dummy was taken by East's queen! Now South had to lose two diamonds, two hearts,
