Largest Evaporation

GREEN BAY ME The North ern Paper Mills put a \$2,000,000 sulphite liquor evaporation plant into operation Tuesday and set we world's records in the campaign to clean up rivers and streams flowing through industrial areas.

Milan Boex, company president turned a valve which sent a flow of spent sulphite liquor into the huge stainless steel evaporating equipment. The li-quor, a residue of papermaking. will be reduced to 65 per cent concentration of solids atomiz-ed with stream and burned in industrial boilers.

It has taken two years to build the evaporating plant which Boox said "is the world's largest evaporator devoted to stream improvement. The Fox River and Green Bay now climb into top place as major bodies of water most completely cleared of sulphite pollution anywhere

in the world. After a shakedown period of several weeks, the evaporator will receive 101,000 pounds of sulphite liquor every hour and educe it to 15,500 pounds of 65 per cent concentration of solids The process will return hourly more than 85,000 pounds of distilled water to the Fox River.
