## Uncle Ray's Corner

### Shark Stalks Man

There has been much argument as to whether a shark always turns over before it seizes, or bites, a victim.  
 It seems to be a fact that sharks turn over when they eat garbage floating on the water after being dropped from an ocean vessel. Since their mouths are under their heads, they find it more simple to obtain floating food by turning so that their mouths will be upward.  
 Fish experts say, however, that sharks behave differently when they attack living victims. Usually they seize a live fish by raising their snouts a little, just before striking.  
 Certain sharks (but not all of them) are man-eaters, and the blue shark is one of those which are ready to eat people if they happen to be around. Whether this follows turns around before striking is of small importance to a man who is struck by its sharp, cruel teeth.  
 Blue sharks swim in many seas. Some of the very large ones grow to be from 15 to 25 feet long.  
 There are blue sharks in the waters around the British Isles. They are less large than some of those in the tropics, but can be deadly. At times, however, they give warning of their coming attacks.  
 A young man—an excellent swimmer—was enjoying the water at a distance of a few hundred yards from the shore of Hastings, England, when he met a blue shark which was able to "swim" around him.  
 The shark barely touched the youth, then came back and rubbed against him more strongly. The rubbing or scraping took place several times.  
 Meanwhile the swimmer (who knew he was being "stalked" by the shark) shouted and splashed water. By good fortune, men in a small boat were nearby and reached him in time to save his life. He climbed aboard, slightly bruised but without serious injury. The shark circled the boat several times but the danger was past.  
 Various records exist of people dying from the bites of blue sharks. Sometimes the victims have been swimmers, but fishermen also suffer from bites.  
 When a shark is caught, the greatest care should be used in handling it. Some sharks which seemed to be dead have given sudden, vicious bites to fishermen.  
 Accounts exist of sharks which have been dropped back in the sea after their livers were taken out, but which then have shown enough life to swim. One of these sharks chased a mackerel.  
 Shark livers are of high value because of the oil and vitamins which they contain. Some restaurants serve shark steaks, and the Chinese are fond of soup made with the fins of these fish. The fins of sharks can be used in place of sandpaper. When the skin is tanned, it makes long-lasting leather.

## Cities Taking Cue on Employees' Ideas

CHICAGO (U.P.) — The Civil Service Assembly says cities are taking a cue from private industry and profiting from employee suggestion systems.  
 Many states and cities have set up cash rewards for ideas which cut costs and save the taxpayers money, the assembly says.  
 Two New York State employees recently saved the state conservation department more than \$40,000 and won \$2,000 for themselves. They invented a chain-saw device for cutting and removing under-water pilings and a \$50,000 job down to \$6,000.  
 A suggestion that old steam radiators in the New York state office building be turned upside down won \$500 for an employee of the department of public works. The change adds 20 years to the life of the radiator.  
 A state hospital employee in California was given \$100 for suggesting that pillow cases be made of torn bed sheets. The idea saves \$1,200 a year at the hospital, the assembly reported.

 The alarmed aunt called the sheriff, who found the boy still running about seven miles from Henryetta. The sheriff hauled the boy back to the aunt's house in a car and returned to his office.  
 A few minutes later he was called again. The boy was off a second time. This time the sheriff told the fleet-footed child to his office for safe keeping until his parents arrived.
