World's Biggest Fish Is "Innocent" Type of Shark

If someone asked you to tell the biggest fish in the world, what would you answer? I feel sure that few, if any, regular readers of this column would name the whale.

The honor of being the biggest fish goes to a huge shark, because it is so large, this shark has been named the "whale shark" but it is a true fish, and has nothing to do with the whale family.

Most whale sharks live in the warmer waters of the ocean, but a few of them swim northward. On an August day, some years ago, a telephone call came to the American Museum of Natural History, New York.

After studying the "monster," Mr. Gudger said, "This is a whale shark. It is rare for a shark of the kind to get as far north as Long Island."

A tape measure showed the whale shark to be 31 and a half feet long. The mouth had a width of three feet and eight inches! The fish was alive when captured, but died after being towed ashore. Crowds of people paid to look at the body. The skin was sold to a wealthy man, but the skull was donated to the museum.

A few whale sharks with a length of from 50 to 35 feet have been measured. The mouth of one of the big fellows is large enough to swallow a man, but there is little, if any, danger. Whale sharks have small teeth, and their

Voice from 'Outer Space' Interrupts N. Y. Radio Show

NEW YORK — A high, thin voice professing to be from "outer space" interrupted a New York radio show Wednesday with a telephone call warning earthmen to stop talking about flying saucers "or your planet will be annihilated."

That was the start of a king-size "whodunnit" mystery. The call came into the NBC studios in the Waldorf Astoria hotel during the Tex McCrary and Jim Falkenburg breakfast show. At the time they were interviewing former Marine Maj. Donald E. Keyhoe about his new book, "Flying Saucers from Outer Space."

NBC officials said they didn't know who called, why or from where. And McCrary, stunned by the call, told his listeners he didn't know anything about it yet but hoped to be able to explain the whole thing later.

Bob Klew, NBC producer who took the call from the hotel switchboard said he listened to the caller for about five minutes before turning the phone over to McCrary. McCrary held a hand microphone near the telephone, and the caller's voice whined out over the air.

"This is a voice from outer space. I warn you earthmen to stop talking about flying saucers, about bombs and preparations for war, for unless you learn to live in peace your planet will be annihilated."

Telephone calls from startled listeners began jamming the hotel switchboard. NBC officials also reported a flood of calls, some of them nearly hysterical. McCrary immediately denied that he and his wife were in any way responsible.

Keyhoe also said he had no connection with the call and his publisher, Henry Holt and Co., said they would never consider such a stunt. NBC officials disclaimed all responsibility.
