The legend of Glenn Miller and his orchestra has been recreated and expanded by RCA Victor in an elaborate, limited-edition album called simply "Glenn Miller."

Born in padded white, the set consists of 10 twelve-inch long-playing sides carrying an anthology of Miller's music from 1939 through 1942.

For example we learn that in 1940 alone more than 3,000,000 copies of his records were sold and that his gross income, including royalties from discs, topped \$800,000.

When Men Worshipped Sun

In records of the Old Stone Age in Europe, no proof has been found that the people had a religion of any kind.

Big changes come about in the Late Stone Age and in the Age of Copper and Bronze. Then there were some, at least, who followed a religion of sun worship.

Long rows of stones exist in western France, near a town called Carnac. The stones range from 3 to 13 feet in height.

The moon appeared to be about the same size as the sun. Probably the people of the Late Stone Age supposed that the width of the full moon was the same as that of the sun.

When people learned about the existence of the summer solstice (marking the longest time of daylight each year) they were on the way toward building up a yearly calendar.

In any case, early men were able to count time by days and months. The time from one full moon to another was a month, or "month."
