JACOBY ON BRIDGE

Most of my readers probably remember that New York City was threatened by a small-pox epidemic some years ago, and that the citizenry was vaccinated by the millions within a few days.

During all the confusion some of the vaccine became contaminated with fissionomania germs, and those who were exposed to this vaccine have been fission addicts ever since. They are safe against smallpox, but they suffer terrible agony unless they take several fissiones every day.

The declarer in today's hand was obviously a victim of this dread malady. When West opened the seven of diamonds, South unthinkingly played low from the dummy in order to take the finesse.

This was a had time to finesse. East won with the king of diamonds and shifted to the six of spades. West won with the king of spades and then cleverly led the deuce of spades, allowing dummy's lack to win.

South had to begin the hearts to have any play for his contract, and this permitted East to take the ace of hearts and return his last spade. This was just what West had been hoping for when he led the deuce of spades to dummy's jack.

West now had the ace-10 of spades over. South's queen-suit and was bound to win two more tricks in the suit. Three spade tricks, a diamond, and a heart were enough to defeat the contract.

While you're shedding a tear for South, see what would have happened if he had been healthy enough to resist the fissiones at the first trick. South wins the first trick in dummy with the ace of diamonds and leads a low
