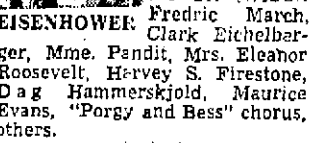

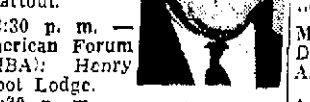

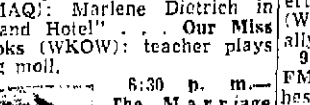

Uncle Ray's Corner 'Gifts' from South America

Lately I have been thinking about some of the gifts which South America supplied to the world. These include white potatoes, tapioca, guanine, rubber and hammocks.

When Columbus sailed to the New World—461 years ago this month—white people knew nothing about the things I have named. Indians in certain parts of South America—namely Peru and Chile—had wild potatoes to eat when they so desired.

The white potato—often called the "Irish potato"—was taken to Europe within a century after the first voyage of Columbus. A monument was set up in a German town (Offenburg) with an inscription meaning: "St. Francis Drake, who introduced the potato to Europe in 1580."



Potatoes Grew Well

There is a question as to whether Drake really was first to transfer white potatoes to Europe. Spaniards may have planted potatoes in Spain before Drake started to sail the seas. In any case white potatoes were planted on the continent of Europe, and on the British Isles, and became an important food crop. The plant grew so well in Ireland that the name of Irish potatoes became common for them.

Vera Weikel Adams, Madison soprano, Saturday announced that she will accept pupils for voice instruction. She will specialize in vocal technique and voice placement.

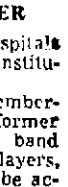
