GM Buys Kaiser Willow Run Plant

DETROIT (AP)—Kaiser Motors Corp., fledgling member of the automobile industry in Detroit, Tuesday announced sale of its own transmission plant was destroyed by fire last Aug. 12. GM will use the plant to make Hydra-Matic transmissions. Its own transmission plant was destroyed by fire last Aug. 12. Kaiser is moving to its Willys division in Toledo, O., where production of the Henry J. Kaiser and Willys cars and trucks will be consolidated under one roof. General Motors has been leasing approximately one-third of the wartime bomber plant since Aug. 21. Transmission equipment was installed and the first Hydra-Matics came off the assembly line just last Wednesday, 12 weeks after the \$50,000,000 fire at Livonia. Kaiser will use the entire purchase price, plus an additional \$613,000, to reduce its debt of \$45,253,000 to the Reconstruction Finance Corp. to \$18,640,000. At one time Kaiser owed the government \$74,789,843.
