JACOBY ON BRIDGE

 Whole books have been written about the opening lead, but nobody pays much attention to the leader's partner. If he gets a chance to lead, later on, what suit should he lead?
 If you find yourself in this position you may get some help from two general rules.
 "Lead up to weakness," says one rule. In other words, pick out the dummy's weakest suit and lead that suit in the hope that your partner has some strength says the other rule.
 This rule was so highly regarded in the old days of whist that there were only two acceptable reasons for failing to return your partner's suit — lack of any card in the suit, and sudden death.
 Neither of these rules should be followed slavishly. By the time you win your trick, you've had a chance to look at the dummy. Perhaps you have also found out something about declarer's hand. Use all such information to pick the most effective lead instead of relying on general rules. For example, put yourself in East's place in the hand shown below.
 West opened the four of clubs, and dummy won with the jack. Declarer thought for a second before 75,000 fans.
 It's unbelievable some of them runs he made and catches of passes it also shows his greatness in the All-Star game.

 The only coaching that Elroy needed, that I could see, was some secret practice on his strength, kisses and hugs. He could stand some coaching there.
 That was the only time I penalized him in the whole picture.
 two and then led dummy's low club to the ace and returned a low trump towards dummy. West played low, dummy played the jack, and East won with the queen of spades.
 It was now up to East to find the most effective return lead. If he led up to dummy's weakness he would return a heart; and if he returned his partner's suit, he would lead a club. Either lead would allow declarer to win, draw trumps safely, and knock out the ace of diamonds at leisure.
 Instead of blindly following a general rule, East thought about the actual hand. It seemed clear to him that declarer did not have the ace of trumps. If South had the ace of trumps he would not have bothered to lead a club to his hand before attacking the trump suit; nor would he have taken a trump finesse on the first round of that suit.
 On the basis of this reasoning, East decided that his partner had the ace of trumps. He then proceeded to violate all general rules by leading the ace and another diamond, right up to dummy's strength.
 Now declarer was dead. He led a trump, but West won with the ace and led a third diamond, which East trumped, to set the contract.
