JACOBY ON BRIDGE

Have you ever seen the sort of player who will play the first card from the dummy before the fire dummy has been put down?

This speedy play sometimes saves him as much as two or three seconds, but he gives it back immediately by going into a huddle over the second trick.

Before I go into the blood-curdling tale of what happened to such a player in today's grand slam, but he neglected the precaution just described. When West opened in three of clubs, North carelessly put his clubs down first.

South got his free finesse in clubs, but it cost him his grand slam. He couldn't get back to his hand to draw trumps. At the second and third tricks he drew trumps with dummy's ace and king, but then he had to try cashing two diamonds in the hope of getting to his hand by ruffing a third diamond. He never made it because West ruffed the second diamond.

If South had waited to see his whole dummy before making his first play, he would have counted 13 easy tricks—six trumps, a heart, four diamonds and two clubs. The correct play, obviously, is to win with dummy's ace of clubs, take two top trumps, and enter the South hand with the king of clubs to draw the rest of the trumps.

South certainly picked the hard way to learn his lesson.

City's October Relief Costs Total \$11,657

Madison's net relief cost last month was \$11,657, an increase of \$4,486 over that of September, which totaled \$7,171, and \$2,241 over the \$9,416 total for October, 1952, the monthly report of Elma Christianson, public welfare director, showed Friday.

Active relief cases at the beginning of the month totaled 172, compared with 152 in September, and 57 new cases were opened during the month, while 56 cases were closed, leaving 173 active at the end of the month.

Loss of employment accounted for six of the new cases, 20 were due to illness or disability, and 20 were attributed to other causes.
