# JACOBY ON BRIDGE

By Oswald Jacoby

Some of my correspondents have asked me for a hand illustrating the Gerber Convention. I give them today's hand, in which I held the South in the recent Individual Tournament in Houston.

My partner, Capt. L. A. Welsh of the U. S. Coast Guard, used the Gerber Convention skillfully and put me in a strange slam contract. It was odd to play the hand at six spades without a trump in my hand.

Captain Welsh's jump to four clubs was a special slam convention, named after Johnny Gerber of Houston. Such a jump to four clubs does not promise a club suit; it merely asks partner to show how many aces he holds, very much like the Blackwood bid of four no-trump.

In responding to a Gerber bid of four clubs, you show no aces by bidding four diamonds; one ace, by bidding four hearts; two aces, by bidding four spades; and so on. In the hand shown today, for example, I showed two aces by bidding four spades.

Very often, your partner will know from this one response how high he wants to bid. In this case, my partner knew that one ace was missing and that a small slam was the limit of the hand. Even the small slam

When today's hand was actually played in the tournament, most tables got to six spades, played from the North position. The opening lead of the queen of clubs defeated them very quickly.

At my table, the slam was played from the South position. If West had opened a club, my king would have stopped the suit in time. West actually opened a diamond; and it was a cinch to win the first trick, ruff a low diamond in dummy, draw trumps, and then take the rest.

No men need bother to apply. Miss Putnam said. When she says women only, she means it.

Of course, she added, hastily, the safari will be led by Bunny Allen, an adventurer so handsome she puts Clark Gable to shame, and two other white hunters.

African natives will wait on the feminine hunters hand and foot, carrying their valises containing lipstick and sun-tan oil, lolling the guns and cameras through the brush, and doing all the laundry and cooking.

"It will be much less rugged than roughing it in the Adirondacks," she said.

Miss Putnam, an airlines employee, said she had hiked in the Andes, skied in the Alps, and swam at the beach on Waikiki. Now she wants real adventure—and she hopes to have plenty of company while she's about it.

Present plans call for Miss Putnam and 14 other Khaki-clad damsels to leave New York by airplane Jan. 6. They will fly to Nairobi, Kenya, and then go by truck into the jungle to a camp established by Allen.

After two weeks of hunting there, Miss Putnam plans to take her companions to Mombassa, Zanzibar, Southern Rhodesia, and Victoria Falls. The whole trip will take 34 days, she said.

## Sir Adrian Gets Offer to Hunt His Ancestral Ghost

EDINBURGH, Scotland (U.P.) — Sir Adrian Dunbar, the Maryland farmer-handyman who inherited a baronetcy and a 3,400-acre estate in Scotland, was swamped Sunday with suggestions from well-wishers, ranging from what Tartan to wear to an offer to hunt down his ancestral ghost.

Sir Adrian and his wife are spending several days here consulting with attorneys on the many thorny financial problems which beset the estate. He will probably journey to his manor house of Mochrum park in the southwest corner of Scotland on Tuesday.

Their neighbors and tenants plan a modest welcome for the publicity-shunning baronet who has expressed his desire only to be a good neighbor to those who live on his 15 dairy farms.

Elliot O'Donnell of Bristol, England, offered to hunt the ghost of Lady Jacobina Dunbar, an 18th century mistress of Mochrum park, who legend says haunted the now tumbledown manor as the "White Lady."

O'Donnell said he would track down the White Lady free of charge, if Sir Adrian would pay his expenses.

Charles Gentry, of London, one of Britain's foremost experts, gave his advice on the Dunbar tartan to Sir Adrian in case the 60-year-old 12th baronet wanted to wear a kilt.
