## Quits Ancient Game

One of the world's oldest sports is "throwing the discus" it was popular in Greece 2,500 years ago.

The sport of throwing the discus is believed to have led to the modern game of quoits (pronounced "kwoits"). This game is played with rings of iron, just a bit wider than the modern discus.

The game of quoits is played on village greens all over Wales and northern England. It also is followed in some parts of the United States and Canada.

Game of Skill

Quoits is more a game of skill than strength, but there must be a good deal of strength in a player if he follows the old rules. Those rules place the pegs, or "hobs," from 54 to 63 feet apart. Often the hobs are placed closer. The distance of the throw may be as little as 30 feet. If a quoit falls around the hob, it is called a "ringer." If it leans on the hob, it is called a "leaver" or "hobber."

The rules of the game are much the same as those of horseshoe. Rubber quoits are made and sold for the use of children.
