British Scientists Urge Fluoridation

CHICAGO (U.P.)—A team of British scientists has asked Britain to put fluorides in its public water to help prevent tooth decay, according to the American Dental Association.

The ADA Journal said four British scientists spent an "extensive" three-month investigation in the United States and Canada before urging adoption of fluoridation in their country.

Their recommendations were put in a recent British government White Paper, the Journal said.

"Should the recent recommendations of four eminent health authorities from Great Britain be adopted reasonably soon," the Journal said, "the dental health of British children beginning at least with the next generation, will be considerably better than that of their fathers."

U.W. Chorus Will Present Bach Work

Prof. Paul G. Jones of the University of Wisconsin School of Music will lead his University Chorus in a performance of "Magnificat" and Bach's "Christmas Oratorio" on Tuesday, Dec. 15, beginning at 8 p.m.

Because of the size of the chorus, which this year includes 219 young men and women, the concert has been moved from Music Hall to the Wisconsin Union theater, where students and faculty will be admitted on free tickets and the public for a small charge.

Beginning Dec. 1, tickets may be obtained at the Union box office.

Tenor Ralph Nielsen of Chicago, well-known throughout the Midwest for his oratorio, concert, radio, television, and opera appearances, will be starred as the Evangelist in the Bach work and in the tenor part of the "Magnificat."

 Bettina Bjorksten, Madison soprano and member of the School of Music and Vocational School faculties, will be soloist for the "Oratorio" along with Donald Weiss, bass, teaching assistant in the School, and Ruth Zeller, contralto, music major from Plymouth.

For the "Magnificat," soloists will be Daniel Saunders, senior from Green Bay for the baritone parts, Mrs. Bjorksten, for the mezzo soprano, and Mary Otto, Oconomowoc, contralto. Organist Gertrude Stultman of Stoughton and Pianist Juliette Gerke of Madison will play the instrumental accompaniment.

According to Prof. Jones, the "Magnificat" has never until this year been published in the U. S., and is consequently being given many performances this season. His 87 sopranos, 72 contraltos, 25 tenors, and 35 basses are rehearsing strenuously to make the campus performance one of the best.

Another Irish Castle Will Bite the Dust

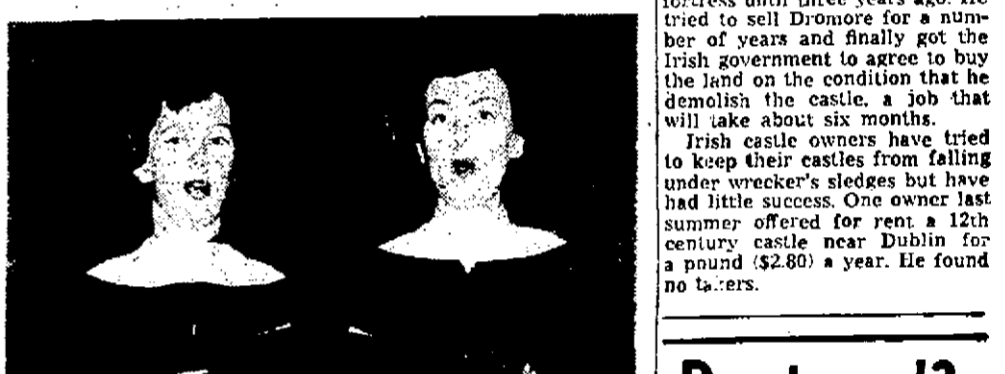
PALLASKENRY, Ireland (U.P.) One of Ireland's most modern castles is to be demolished because no one wants it.

Dromore Castle, built in Limerick County some 80 years ago by the third Earl of Limerick, is just the latest in a series of doomed Irish castles.

Morgan McMahon's sawmill company bought Dromore and its 100 acres of surrounding timber land in 1939. McMahon lived in the chilly gray stone gothic fortress until three years ago. He tried to sell Dromore for a number of years and finally got the Irish government to agree to buy the land on the condition that he demolish the castle, a job that will take about six months.

Irish castle owners have tried to keep their castles from falling under wrecker's sledges but have had little success. One owner last summer offered for rent a 12th century castle near Dublin for a pound (\$2.80) a year. He found no takers.
