Bill Doudna's SPOTLIGHT 'The Cherry Orchard'

TIP O' THE MORNING: Looks like Barbara Ruick at last has found the song that will put her where she belongs among pop singers. It's "Tick Tock Boogie" for MGM.

ANTON CHEKHOV'S "The Cherry Orchard" is a play so unconventional—even in Stark Young's translation—that it needs actors of great talent to ignite it and keep it glowing. These it did not have Tuesday night in the Wisconsin Players production.

It had some good actors, but competence was not enough. Whether it was the production or the translation which omitted some of the tragic overtones caught in a professional showing here in 1944 it is hard to say.

"The Cherry Orchard" had no surprises, no genuine climaxes. It was a play of mood. Things happened, and these things were related to each other, but they led to no denouement. Characters were developed clearly, and in this particular the University of Wisconsin actors did well. Paradoxically, few achieved a sense of reality.

The play told of a noble Russian family whose settings reflected the period and the mood, and in Jonathan Curwin's direction maintained a constant movement without which the effective final scene—largely a bare set with offstage chopping of cherry trees—would have been wasted. Costuming was most precise.
