# Lower State Draft Figure Unknown

Col. Bentley Courtney, state selective service director, said Monday he had no immediate figures on what Wisconsin's February draft call would be in view of recently announced reductions. Secretary of Defense Charles Wilson said Friday the nation's call for February would be dropped to 18,000 from the 23,000 monthly level maintained since last July. When the call is 23,000 Wisconsin furnishes about 3 per cent, or around 600 inductees. Courtney said, adding he expected a proportionate state drop in line with the national reduction.
