# The Art of Donald Anderson

By PROF JOHN F. KIENTZ Department of Art History University of Wisconsin

Sidney Bechet, one of its ablest exponents, once said of the real juzz that it was "three old men playing and nobody listens."

The drawings and paintings of Prof. Donald The drawings and paintings of Prof. Donald Anderson now on view in the Exhibition room of the new University library prove that when this authentic music of the Negro was being played, there was among its devotees at least one who was able to capture its essence in form,

and color, and line.

In his pictorial record of jazz and some of the men who made it, Anderson brings to us as line a transcription of its look and feel as has ever been made. He does this most notably in a group of five designs, ranged on the south

lever been made. He does this most notably in a group of five designs ranged on the south wall. There we have two versions of "Trumpet Practice" and two of "Back Stage" flanking a piece called "Practice."

"Practice" is a large, moody, ingeniously contrived, and planar flat patterning a clarinetist. The man plays centrally out of a blue mood in a surround of angular, "cool" rhythms and accents of shrill, cutting line which seem oddly like those that Prewee Russell used to swirl out like those that Peewee Russell used to swirl out the stick and make prevail over all when he had it, in the old days, at Nick's!

There are many other treatments here and they, too, do justice to this important facet of our musical life and art. They show tactful in-ventiveness, much insight into mood, perceptive analysis of truth, and a personal application of technique. Among these one of the most pleasing voices

Among these one of the most means a term of this instrument Anderson makes a dark, quasi-musical abstract against mellow brown stains. Whoever anywhere has heard and been pleased by true sounds will hear in this sketch a touching echo of the lyric drive and happy phrasing of Bix, and Louie, and Spanier.

To his affection for the real jazz. Anderson adds an interest in the Madison landscape, in the wise patterning of the butterfly fineness of plor-movement in nature, and, most poignantly, he also proves himself to be a master of the kid in art. He knows how rightly to present the ever-present small boy: the child in all of us. In some of his finest work you will find pic-

tured the wonder and the fear of boys growing tured the wonder and the lear of noys growing out of innocence or naively active in it, coming into manhood with at times a generous and sour-raw schooling in apprehension: this artist is sensitive to the design that doubt engenders and he knows that there are those in life who having "No Place to Go" slump into a human against the stark geometry of a showlump against the stark geometry of a show-

With "Aquarium" and "Japanese Kites," Anderson offers an almost flawless treatment of a

derson offers an almost nawless treatment of a subject that appeals to him most deeply, in form and color refreshingly his own.
"Aquarium" delicately fuses marine life and hoys who observe, locking the kids and life into meaningful, poetic mood so that the space and tone notation share poised wonderfully for our view and feel view and feel.

But it is in the "Japanese Kites" that we may have the outstanding achievement in this richly-presented show.

The artist may be unaware that in modern poetry there is a lyric by e. e. cummings with this simple teaching: sending a kite out into the blue is so exhibitating why, in heaven's name do we, become adult, ever let go? Viewing this picture or reading the poem helps us open our hearts to a small treasure provided by talent for understanding and reassurance.

The "Japanese Kites" summarizes with almost geometric precision the spirit of criental and indeed, of all kite-flying. Its color is in small part vivid, in larger areas it is restrained to the darkish background characteristic of the artist. The arrangement is born of a perspective of heights effortlessly leaving us with a free sense of space. The kites move like a Calder mobile in accents of warmth and buoy-ant humor against cool depths of gray. In a lower corner, advoitly angled, are the boys and strings to whom this floating magic properly


