**Uncle Ray's Corner**

**The Steamcoach**

An Englishman named Golds-worthy Gurney was one of the pioneers of the steam-powered automobile. One hundred and twenty-five years have passed since he started to place steam coaches on the roads of England. Gurney was a rich man, and was willing to spend money for large machines to run over the rough highways of that time.

In 1829 Gurney boarded a steam coach and traveled from London to Bath, then back again. During much of the journey, the speed was 15 miles per hour. One of the men who went with him reported that the machine exceeds what could have been expected. Hills were ascended with the greatest ease and safety. The machine far surpassed horse-drawn coaches.

Gurney's "horseless carriages" were very much like stagecoaches, except that they were fitted with steam engines. One of them had room for 18 passengers, and carried a supply of coke along with 60 gallons of water.

A man named Tom Hood believed there was danger of the boiler exploding and wrote a verse which ran: "Instead of journeys, people now may go upon a Gurney. With steam to do the horses' work."

"By power of attorney. 'Trough with a load it may explode. 'And you may be all undone. 'And here you're going up to heaven."

"Instead of up to London." That was what the little said, but Gurney's coaches ran fairly well. They took many persons safely from place to place.

Laws Blocked Progress

Another Englishman, Walter Hancock, worked with steam coaches at about the same time. He made trips with passengers who paid for the adventure.

Automobiles might have come into general favor if laws had not been passed to block their progress. One law ordered that a man should show a red flag, to warn people to get out of the way.

This, and heavy toll taxes for bridges and roads, brought an end to the brave efforts of the pioneers. More than half a century went by before the laws were set right.

# The Sunday Spotlight Record Recommendations

A second album of songs by Anna Russell, the comedienne who will be at the Wisconsin Union theater March 24, has been issued by Columbia, and it's as full of fun as the first.

The first was called "Anna Russell Sings?" The new one is "Anna Russell Sings! Again?" Both were tape-recorded at Russell concerts and transferred to 12-inch LPs.

Highlights of the new disc are a satire on Gilbert and Sullivan, an analysis of Wagner, and a report on a concert introduction by woman's club president.

Another outstanding release comes from MGM. It is Poulenc's "Aubade for Piano and 18 Solo Instruments," played by Fabienne Jacquinot and the Westminster Symphony orchestra. Both the playing and the recording are expert. The second side of the LP holds Debussy's "Fantasie for Piano and Orchestra," played by the same artists with considerable charm.

Again Jacquinot and the Westminster are heard in D'Indy's "Symphony on a French Mountain Air" and Saint-Saens' "Egyptian" concert on an MGM record. Both are satisfactory if not startling.
