 STORY: Nearly everyone knows the story of the Round Table and the tales of chivalry and honor that went with it... this version begins with Arthur asserting himself as the rightful ruler of England, his meeting and love for Lancelot, and the formation of the council known as the Round Table... The pages of the original story unfold pretty much without Hollywood liberties. The love of Lancelot and Arthur's wife, Guinevere, predominates and Morgan's revenge provides the theme "the name does not pay" theme.
 HIGH POINTS: The original battle where Arthur defeats the foe is one of the most dramatic fight scenes in screen history, a marvelously handled sequence heightened by cinemascope... the nostalgic feeling from reliving one of the most romantic stories in literature... good performances by the leading players.
 LOW POINTS: Adults might find the good-vs-evil theme over-simplified but we suspect the producers had the younger audiences in mind.
 VERDICT: An excellent film throughout.
