Pro-West Italians Seek New Leader
 ROME (AP)—Italy's pro-Western leaders groped again Sunday for a formula to end six months of political instability which has become a new worry of the free world.
 For the fourth time since last June's elections, President Luigi Einaudi will begin the formal consultations Monday which precede naming of a new premier.
 This time he is looking for a man to replace Christian Democrat Amintore Fanfani, who tried and failed to build a lasting government on a program of economic reform and anti-communism.
 The fall of Fanfani's 11-day-old government in a no-confidence vote in the Chamber of Deputies Saturday left Italy without a working government for the fourth time in six months.

A successful squeeze will usually produce one extra trick, but there is a very uncommon type of squeeze that will produce two extra tricks.
 One of these rare plays was executed by Dr. Edward Frischauer at the recent National Tournament in Dallas.
 West opened the four of hearts, and Dr. Frischauer played the nine from dummy. East put up the king of hearts, and declarer won with the ace.
 Declarer, naturally, and properly, went after the spades immediately. West's failure to follow suit on the second round of spades was a bitter disappointment, but the fact that West discarded the seven of diamonds was very stimulating.
 There wasn't of course, any problem at all about making six no-trump. Any beginner could get to dummy. In order to take diamond finesse, since even the loss of the finesse would still leave the declarer with twelve tricks.
 The hand was played in a tournament, however. South wanted to make 13 tricks, if possible. In tournament play, the overtrick is often every bit as important as the contract itself.
 Dr. Frischauer correctly reasoned that West was signaling
