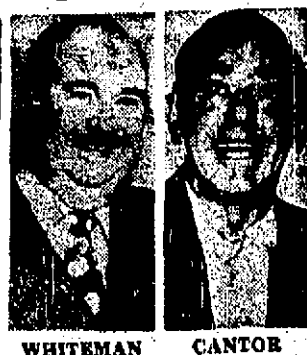

DA VINCI EXHIBIT: The exhibition of models of Leonardo da Vinci inventions and examples of his work which has attracted near-record crowds to the Memorial Union galleries will be on view through Sunday, Feb. 4. It had been scheduled to close two days earlier.

Gallery representatives said it had drawn more visitors than any show in the Union's history except for "Old Masters of the Metropolitan," which had 66,000 viewers when it was here in 1949.

The exhibit, which is sponsored by this Wisconsin Union gallery committee, has an accompanying public lecture series on Leonardo's achievements. The next will be "Leonardo's View of the Biological Nature of Man" by Dr. Oswald Temkin of Johns Hopkins university at 8 p. m. Tuesday in the Wisconsin Union Theater.

MUSIC ON THE AIR: The weekly "Music in Wisconsin" series will be resumed on WHA and the state network at 1 p. m. Sunday, when a program by the Green Bay Symphonette will be presented at 2:30 p. m., beginning with recordings of "Regional Music of Northern Spain" accompanied by a descriptive narration by Roma Borst, of the University of Wisconsin department of Spanish and Portuguese.

POWELL SUES: Actor-director Dick Powell has filed suit in superior court at Hollywood,

Calif., asking an injunction to prevent anyone but himself from being credited with direction of the Broadway hit, "The Caine Mutiny Court Martial."
 Powell's suit was directed against Paul Gregory and Co., which are charged with him four days before the play opened in New York. He claimed he had spent several months working on the play both before and after its California tryouts but was replaced just prior to the Broadway opening by Charles Laughton as director.
 Powell claimed that his contract entitled him to billing as director wherever the play is produced and in all subsequent companies, plus two per cent of the receipts from the original production and one per cent from any secondary productions.
 The suit asked that the court order an accounting of all proceeds and asked that Powell be awarded his share.
 The play is a dramatization of court martial scenes from Herman Wouk's best-selling novel, "The Caine Mutiny," which was produced in New York. Powell disclosed that there was a dispute over who should receive credit as director. Gregory as producer, said that Laughton was "entirely responsible for the direction."
 Powell said that he got into a slight argument with Henry Fonda, star of the play, and that Fonda threatened to quit if he continued as director. Powell said that he voluntarily left the production temporarily last fall by agreement with Gregory, but that his contract still remained in effect.
 The play was reported a hit on Broadway and apparently is destined for a long run there.
