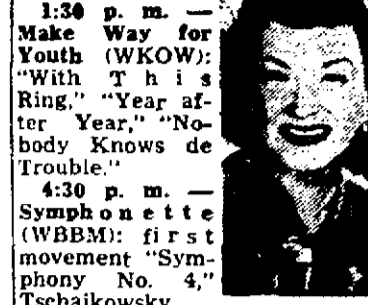

TIP OF THE MORNING:
 Daylight time will go into effect April 25. Few radio programs will change, but television listings hereabouts will be revised drastically.

BEGINNING tonight, WKOW's "Blues in the Night" will emanate from the Veterans Administration hospital.

The show will be recorded there this afternoon and will be broadcast by WKOW at 7:30 tonight.

Bill Patrick, "the Hambone" of the weekly program, will be master of ceremonies. Featured on the first program from the hospital will be jazz played by Dick Ruedebusch and the Dixie Bash band—Greg Blied, Eddie Stein, Roger Smith, Bob Haggerty, and Gordie Kemmeter. Jan Hagen will sing.

Patrick, the band, and Miss Hagen will do a one-hour show at the hospital, with a half-hour portion being taped for broadcast.

Dr. M. C. Thomas, manager of the hospital, will speak, telling of the hospital's work and its cooperation with the University of Wisconsin school of medicine.

Future programs will have the Josh Salter, Chuck Berlin, and other orchestras, through the cooperation of the AFL Madison Musicians assn.

KEYBOARDS: Even though Luan Hoely is leaving WIBA for Chicago, the "Magic Keyboards" program will continue to carry the music of Luan and her mother, Mrs. H. C. Hoely, at 6:15 p.m. Saturdays.

"ROMEO AND JULIET": When Milton college begins its second 50 years of Shakespearean plays next month, the cast of "Romeo and Juliet" will include three Madison students. They are Wilf Mayer, as Romeo; Richard Husebo, as a watchman, and Marilyn Nygaard as a dancer, Virginia Burdick, East Aurora, N. Y., will play Juliet.

Other Madison area actors will be David Bell, Robert Ralston, Harry O'Leary, Dick Brodie, and John Thompson, Janesville; Judy Spencer, Footville; Paul Green, Milton; David Whitford, Mayville.

AT BELOIT: The Court theater will open its fourth season of arena plays June 22 on the Beloit college campus. Kirk Denmark will direct the nine plays, which will run from Tuesday through Saturday nights. The season will end Aug. 21.

Wesley Lau and Anne Costello, New York City, will head the acting company. Guest actresses will include Nancy Eichardt, former director of the Madison Theater Guild.

FIDDLERS CONTEST: Cliff Hutchison, of the state department of agriculture, again will be master of ceremonies for the Southern Wisconsin Old Time Fiddlers' contest, to be held April 25 at the Madison Community center.

CYCLES BY THE MILLIONS: The transmission frequency of the new WHA-TV antenna involves astronomical figures which only an electrical engineer can fully appreciate, reports Glenn Kehler, technical consultant for the State Radio council, which will operate the station.

WHA will operate on Channel 21, the 512-518 megacycle band. A megacycle is a million cycles. This means 512 million cycles per second, the minimum measure of the electrical impulses which reproduce the picture in the remitters.

The band of frequencies, Kehler reported, is 6 megacycles wide. This is divided, with approximately 4 1/2 megacycles used to carry the picture and 1 1/2 megacycles used to carry the sound. The equipment is really two transmitters in one, with the picture using AM (amplitude modulation) transmissions, and the sound being broadcast by the FM (frequency modulation) system.

WHA-TV is now undergoing transmitter and equipment tests preparatory to the formal inauguration of program service on May 3. A test pattern is on the air on Channel 21 each day from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. to enable servicemen to check the adjustment of receivers so they will properly tune in the new station.
