

**TWO OF AMERICA'S** finest college band conductors—and a lot of people would make the description stronger—led the University of Wisconsin bands in their traditional Palm Sunday concert at the Wisconsin Union theater Sunday afternoon.

They were Dr. A. A. Harding, director emeritus of bands at the University of Illinois, and his former pupil and assistant, Prof. Raymond R. Dvorak, director of bands at Wisconsin.

The results were as expected—a concert full of both musicianship and showmanship, with emphasis on the former. Soloists added to the concert's sheen—Julie and Juliette Gerke, duo-pianists, in Poulenc's over-enthusiastic "Concerto in D Minor for Two Pianos" as arranged for hand by Carl T. Skowland, and James Borgaro, saxophonist, in Durand's "Waltz in E Flat."

The eErke twins played the Poulenc work with polish and poise, giving its bits of satire a certain crispness, performing the singing phrases with fluency, and handling the noisy segments with more power than you'd expect from such slight girls. Skowland's arrangement was a major accomplishment in itself, catching the flavor of the original without benefit of strings.

Borgaro's solo was notable for its rapid-fire delivery, done efficiently without sacrificing to equality. Applause for him almost stopped the performance.

Harding conducted his own transcription of a portion of a Strauss "Thus Spake Zarathustra," a powerful piece of music which benefitted in many ways by transfer to band through Harding's knowing arrangement.

In it, the band was probably at its peak for the afternoon, producing massive sound without a flutter and maintaining solid tone in the sustained passages.

The clarinet section gave an excellent account of itself in unison work in the first part of the "Prince Igor" ballet music. The audience recognized the origin of "Strangers in Paradise" in the second portion, beautifully played.

Seven trumpets at the rear of the balcony added to the color of Newman's "Conquest," and there was fine solo work by clarinet and trombone in "The Russian Easter" overture.

Harding and Dvorak shared the baton for a group of Sousa marches, climaxed by "The Stars and Stripes Forever," with the cornets, trumpets, and trombones arrayed across the front of the

The beautiful thing about being a guest columnist is the fact that you don't have to worry about getting fired.

Of course, a guest columnist may get Crosby fired. However, that wouldn't matter, because Crosby is wealthy in his own right. He owns the world's largest collection of Labor records.

Now that you new viewers have your sets, you will find yourselves reading a lot of things about TV in the various newspapers. In addition, you will be reading magazines such as "TV Guide," "TV Digest," "True Life," "TV Stars," and such. In all this mass of literature you will find a lot of technical or "trade" terms, the meaning of which may not be clear to you. I have, therefore, prepared a list of these terms and phrases with their definitions so that you may read all the interesting news about television with insight and enjoyment.

**Burrows' Complete Glossary of Television Terms**

**Intimate show:** a comedy program with no laughs.

**Casual show:** a comedy program in which everyone walks slowly.

**Situation comedy:** a program which has the same story every week.

**Satire:** jokes which do not get laughs.

**Sure-fire joke:** a joke that someone else got a big laugh with.

**Old tired material:** a sure-fire joke that doesn't get a laugh.

**Fresh humor:** old sure-fire jokes told by a young comedian.

**Literate humor:** old sure-fire jokes told by a young comedian with eyeglasses.

**Earthy humor:** dirty jokes.

**Glamour:** that certain indefinable something about a girl who has a large bosom.

**Sincerity:** the art of making believe you are a nice guy.

**Comedy writer:** a man who is hired to write those jokes which the comedian makes up on the spur of the moment.

**Song stylist:** a singer.

**Internationally famous song stylist:** a singer.

**Toast of two continents:** a foreign singer.

**Singing personality:** a lousy singer.

**Long term contract:** a contract for 13 weeks.

**Seven-year contract:** a contract for 13 weeks.

**\$10,000 a week salary:** \$1,500.

**Variety show:** a program which has the same acts every other week.

**Rating:** a figure which is obtained by a survey and which tells you the size of your listening audience and which is com-

pletely inaccurate if it is low. Rating trouble: sponsor is unhappy about your rating.

Serious rating trouble: you have a high rating but the sponsor's wife doesn't like you.

Juvenile program: shows that are too gruesome for adults.

Guest star: an actor who gets paid for the privilege of being inducted.

Surprise guest star: a guest star who has only rehearsed for two days.

Big name guest star: a guest star who is washed up in pictures.

Brief announcement: a long commercial.

Feud: in TV circles a feud is a fake or simulated public quarrel between two stars who really don't like each other.

Showmanship: that sixth sense which makes a producer realize that if he can get Ethel Merman, Jimmy Durante, Danny Kaye, Bob Hope, Bing Crosby, and Greta Garbo, he'll have a great show.

Idea man: a man who thinks up different ways to put on "What's My Line."
