As Casanova he is to tempt a beautiful young countess about to be wed. If she succumbs to Casanova her marriage to the Duke is off. All hinges on the procurement of an heirloom petticoat. Pepe is assisted by the real Casanova's flight from creditors and valet, Lucio. Further aid is rendered by lascivious Francesca, the local grocery lady. A seventh hour stroke of gallantry saves the countess. What happens to Pepe is left up to the audience.

HIGH POINTS: Hope as a latter day Douglas Fairbanks spoofing the Casanova myth.
 LOW POINTS: Hope hum or depending on contemporary wisecracks is lost in 18th century "humor."

VERDICT: This may have been Casanova's big night but it wasn't Hope's. This epic shouldn't hurt local TV.

Like most other people, the Rietzke's hardly imagined they would ever have any serious hospitalization in their family. However, they did know that being sick could be costly and they wanted to be absolutely sure their budget would never collapse because of hospital expenses. Their letter to Blue Cross stated that they joined "merely as protection."

But seven years later, the Rietzke's did have a serious hospitalization. Without Blue Cross to help them they would have been faced with bills totaling hundreds of dollars. They would have "gone into debt very deeply" said Mr. Rietzke.
